Refugee House Setup

A team of Porirua Anglicans spent time 30 April & 1 May gathering goods from Porirua stores and from those stored at St Anne's. On the morning of 1 May they setup house for a refugee family of seven who arrived 2 May at this house, which will be their first home in New Zealand. Please pray for this family of mum, dad and five girls that they may adjust well to their new home and community. May their sponsor bond well with them and in friendship assist them to negotiate life in a new land.

This project was a joint venture between Carterton Anglicans who supplied most of the household goods we placed in the new refugees' home.

Several refugee homes are being setup this year from teams from the Wellington Diocese under the leadership of Phil McCarthy from Tawa Anglican.
